## Traditional Latin Mass Resources

As you have heard announced at the end of our weekend Masses, Father has started celebrating the Traditional Latin Mass one to two times a week at St. Peter Claver Church. He felt that it would be helpful if you were provided more information about this liturgy to better appreciate its beauty. Below are some links to YouTube videos on the Traditional Latin Mass of the Latin Rite according to the Roman Missal of 1962.

The videos discuss both the rich symbolism, or sacramentality, of the Traditional Mass as well as how to best approach and attend the Tradition Mass to foster deeper and more intense interior and prayerful participation in the Holy Sacrifice of Our Lord.

N.B. YouTube allows you to play videos at up to 2x the speed by clicking on the “Setting” button and then the “Playback speed” option. Generally, 1.5x speed is quite comprehensible and allows one to more quickly get through a long video. Below, the name of the video is listed, followed by the YouTube link, the provider of the video, a brief description, and the approximate length of the video.

Also, a great introductory book to the Tradition Latin Mass is The Latin Mass Explained by Msgr. George J. Moorman. It is an excellent introduction to the symbolism and meaning of all the parts of the Traditional Mass.

There are countless other videos, books, websites, and materials which are available to help foster a deeper understanding and appreciation for the Traditional Liturgies of the Roman Rite. Please see Fr. Scott for more resources.

(N.B. There do exist several groups who claim to be Catholic and to adhere to the Tradition of the Roman Rite, but who are **not** in full communion with the Catholic Church. These groups can have a deceptive online presence and must be avoided. If anyone has a question regarding these groups or whether a specific material is safe to use, please see Fr. Scott.)
