



Pastor's Column:

Faith Comes Through Hearing.....

How many people have you brought to the Church? I have a few people that have come lately to St Cecilia's and St Peter Claver Parishes that have not been baptized, confirmed, or had their first communion as adults. I am starting classes with them and getting them prepared for the reception of their sacraments this Easter. The classes as we know are called RCIA classes. RCIA stand for Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults. In these classes, those who come will learn all the basics of the Catholic faith by attending (or watching) a weekly teaching on the faith.

We see in the Gospel this weekend the blind man Bartimaeus cry out to Jesus by saying:" Jesus Son of David have mercy on me?" Jesus heals him. Can you bring someone to hear about the faith? Bartimaeus receives his sight and his faith by hearing. Bartimaeus had heard of Jesus and then called on Him. Yes, his

sight came from his hearing, and faith grants vision by hearing. True vision is seeing Christ, and having seen Him by hearing, following Him.
